

City Fire Aide Dies

C. G. Hethorn, 51, Headed Signal Setup

Cecil G. Hethorn, 51, of 1223 Bensch st., superintendent of the fire alarm signal system in Lansing since Jan. 1, 1943, died Friday in a Lansing hospital after a long illness.

Mr. Hethorn, who joined the fire department April 30, 1936, supervised the installation and inspection of the 540 fire alarm boxes in the city and also directed work in the police signal system.

It was under his direction that a \$40,000 transmitting and receiving system was installed in fire headquarters, the work being completed in 1961.

An Eastern high school graduate where he was active in athletics, he worked for the Michigan Bell Telephone company and Motor Wheel corporation before joining the fire department.

He was past worshipful master of Capitol Lodge 66, F. & A. M., and a member of the Mt. Hope Methodist church and the International Municipal Signalmen's association.

Surviving are the widow, Pearl E.; two sons, George C., a Lansing fireman, and David W., Lansing; a daughter, Mrs. Susan Bowler, Lansing; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Hethorn, Lansing; three sisters, Mrs. Marjorie Keyes, Mrs. Beatrice Kellerman and Mrs. Mary Gordon, all of Lansing, and six grandchildren.
