Ex-Editor 1962 Succumbs

**O. E. McLaughlin, 80,
Published Weekly**

 VERMONTVILLE, March 3 —
 Oliver E. McLaughlin, 80, for 31
 years publisher of the weekly Ver-
 montville Echo, died Saturday in
 a Charlotte hospital. He had been
 hospitalized a week.

A native of Eaton county, Mr.
 McLaughlin worked in Detroit as
 a tool maker and engraver be-
 fore returning to Vermontville to
 buy the Echo in 1917. He sold the
 newspaper in 1948.

He had served a term as presi-
 dent of the village, was a justice
 of the peace for 16 years, and was
 president of the Citizens elevato
 for 20 years.

From 1927 to 1952 he operated
 the Sterling Type Foundry in Ver-
 montville.

He was a member of Asher
 Lodge No. 91, F. & A. M., Detroit
 and of Zion chapter No. 171, R.
 A. M., Nashville.

He is survived by the widow,
 Ethel, and one sister, Mrs. Doro-
 thea Ashdown, Detroit.
