**Harry J. Hawes
Dies Friday 19 61**

Harry J. Hawes, 70, a Brookfield township farmer died at 4:00 p.m. Friday at Hayes-Green-Beach hospital, where he had been a patient for four days.

Mr. Hawes was born December 20, 1891 in Parma, the son of Arthur and Myrtie (Benn) Hawes and had been a resident of this area for 43 years. He was married July 11, 1914 to Lois Hall. Mr. Hawes was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church.

Surviving are the wife; a son Joseph, Brookfield township; two daughters Miss Kathleen Hawes and Mrs. Kenneth (Helen) Benjamin, both of Lansing; five grandchildren; the mother of Vermontville; a brother Ray; Oakland, California and a sister Mrs. Lloyd Faust, Vermontville.

Home. Mass was celebrated at 10:00 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Catholic church. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery at Vermontville.

THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The constitution provides that a board of eight persons elected at the spring election shall constitute a Board of Regents to control the University of Michigan. Said board is a body corporate having power to enact ordinances, by-laws and regulations for the government of the university; they have power to elect a president and appoint such professors and tutors as may be necessary; to appoint a secretary, librarian, treasurer, steward, and such other officers as the institution may require; to provide and arrange courses of study; to provide for the keeping of meteorological tables; receive and expend all moneys for the support of the institution.

Act 85, P. A. 1937, transferred to the Regents of the University all the property of the State Psychopathic Hospital to be used for a Neuro-Psychiatric Institute and clinic, the entire control of which is vested in the Board of Regents.
