He is a member and secretary of the State Board of Education, and is ex-officio member of the Board of Regents of the University of Michigan, the State Board of Agriculture and of all other boards having control of public instruction.

The Superintendent of Public Instruction is a member of other state boards having duties not directly concerned with public education among which are the State Board of Canvassers, the State Administrative Board, the Municipal Finance Commission, the State Board of Auditors, the State Board of Escheats, and the Board of Review of the State Police Pension Fund.

THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The constitution provides that a board of eight persons elected at the spring election shall constitute a Board of Regents to control the University of Michigan. Said board is a body corporate having power to enact ordinances, by-laws and regulations for the government of the university; they have power to elect a president and appoint such professors and tutors as may be necessary; to appoint a secretary, librarian, treasurer, steward, and such other officers as the institution may require; to provide and arrange courses of study; to provide for the keeping of meteorological tables; receive and expend all moneys for the support of the institu-
