Mrs. F. Weber

Graveside services were held for Mrs. Fannie M. Weber, 88, at the Union cemetery in Maple Grove township, Thursday at 3 p.m. Mrs. Weber passed away Tuesday, June 26 at the home of her sister Mrs. Grace L. Straus of Grand Rapids, where she has resided since 1957. She was the widow of Al Weber, well known Michigan newspaper man who was publisher of the Cheboygan Observer for many years and passed away in 1957. He was one of the three publishers to be named to the Publishers Hall of Fame at Lansing so honored in 94 years.

Mr. and Mrs. Weber were well known here as were former residents. Mr. Weber was connected with the local newspaper from 1898 until selling the business to Mr. and Mrs. A.J. Dann in 1905.

Mrs. Weber was a sister of the late Jennie (Mrs. Otis) Miner and aunt of Neil Roe and the late Grace Nicol.

Wayne Bosworth Suffers Fatal Heart Attack

Wayne A. Bosworth 41, Standard Oil Agent here for the past 13 years, died suddenly Wednesday morning in his sleep from a heart attack, at his home 2117 Ionia Road.

Mr Bosworth was born January 23, 1921 at Mulliken, the son of Leon and Hazel (King) Bosworth. He served in the European theater from February 1943 to April 1946. In 1947 he was married to Kathryn Hager at Lansing, and has been a resident of Vermontville since that time. He served on the Village Council from 1956 to 1958. He was one of the originators of the Thornapple Valley Riding club, and a member of the Quarter Horse Association; he was also a member of the Vermontville Masonic Lodge 232 F & AM, the Dewitt Clinton Consistory, the Lions club, Chamber of Commerce, the American Legion Demoray - Childs Post 222. He served as Commander of the Post in 1950.

Surviving besides the widow, Kathryn is his mother, Mrs Hazel Bosworth of Charlotte; four brothers, Allen of Toledo, John of Mulliken, William of Sunfield and Larry stationed in Kansas with the United States Army.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 2:00 pm from the Vermontville Congregational church. Rev. Edwin Clark will officiate. Burial will be in Woodlawn cemetery.
