Donald Eugene Stairs 17, who would have been a member of the 17 senior class at Vermontville drowned Sunday afternoon shortly after 3:00 pm., in Jordan Lake, Lake Odessa. Donald was a cousin to the three Benner children of rural Hastings who were killed in an auto accident Thursday. Mr and Mrs Robert Benner Inad taken Donald to the home of his grandparents, Mr and Mrs Clarence Birman, with their only surviving child, Clarence 15 to visit. *

Donald, who could not swim, was trying to wade from one raft to anher, suddenly slipped over the drop off. According to other swim-mers he seemed to fight off two younger swimmers who came to his aid. His body was not recovered until 7:11 pm.

HAR He was born May 17, 1945 in Lan-JOSEP sing, the son of Richard and Kathryn (Birman) Stairs. He entered Vermontville Community School in February 1958 when his parents moved to R1 Vermontville.
