

Educator Dies at 66

Miss Blanche Bigelow Taught Here 40 Years

Miss Blanche Susan Bigelow, retired Lansing elementary school principal, died Sunday morning in a Lansing hospital. She was 66.



Miss Bigelow, who lived at 1132 Weber Dr., Lansing, had been in ill health for some time.

She retired from the Lansing school system in Miss Bigelow June, 1959, ending a 40-year career as teacher and school administrator here. Prior to her retirement she lived in Williamston.

She came to the Lansing school system in 1919 and taught at Foster Elementary School until 1924 when she was named principal of the High Street School.

She served as principal at High Street School through 1926 when she was transferred as principal of Moores Park Elementary School. In 1935 she was named principal of Willow Elementary School, a post she held until her retirement three years ago.

Miss Bigelow was past president of the Lansing Education Association and Lansing Department of Elementary School Principals. She was a member of the National Education Association and Michigan Education Association. She was also a member of the Williamston Methodist Church.

She is survived by one sister, Mrs. Kenneth Hewes of Lansing.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Wednesday at Gorsline Bros. Funeral Home in Williamston. Burial will be in Summit Cemetery there.
