

Arthur L. Barningham 78, passed away suddenly Monday afternoon at his home on East Main Street. He had taken Mrs. Barningham to get her hair done, and didn't answer the phone when she called him to come after her. She found him in the garage where he had suffered a heart attack. Mr. Barningham had been in ill health for the past nine years when he suffered a heart attack and was in the hospital for several weeks.

Mr. Barningham had been in the insurance business here for over 55 years. He was cashier at the Citizens bank for 23 years. He served as Village and Township clerk, was a director of the Woodlawn cemetery association for forty years, served several terms on the school board, was one of the originators of the Lions club, was a member of the Vermontville Congregational church, and at the time of his death was serving as a deacon, he was also a member of the Maple Syrup Festival Corporation.

Mr. Barningham was born July 2, 1884 in Youngstown, Ohio, the son of John and Mary Ann Barningham. He moved to Vermontville when a small child. He attend school here and also Ferris Institute. June 22, 1909 he was married to Alice Green at Vermontville.

Surviving besides the widow are two sons, Walter of Pontiac, and Donald of Eaton Rapids; one daughter, Mrs Ernest (Katherine) Culp of Charlotte; two brothers, William of Vermontville and Tom of Marshall; two sisters, Mrs. St. Clare Parsons of Atlantic, Ga., and Mrs. Rollin Sprague of Kalamazoo, and seven grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2:00 pm. from the Congregational church. Rev. Howard Lindsay and Rev. Edwin Clark officiated. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.
