Carl Olmstead
Held Friday

Olmstead, 78, former Nashville president, died Saturday at Bradenton, Fla., hospital in ill health for several weeks ago went to recuperate.

various business enterprises in Nashville for more than 20 years. Olmstead was a director of the Co-Op Shipping Association from 1918 until he became secretary in 1924. He was president for several years, then resumed his duties from 1932 until 1935. In 1929, he became manager of the Farmers Co-Operative Association, continuing in that capacity 21 years.

During that time he served four years as director of the Michigan Elevator Exchange, was active in the Barry County Farm Bureau and was a member of the Barry County Fair Board.

Prior to becoming manager of the Elevator at Nashville he was interested in the development of such an organization and was one of the original directors when the group first organized in 1919.

Mr. Olmstead became manager of the Farmers Co-Operative Creamery in 1933, serving as both manager and president of the board of directors until 1945. He was largely responsible for a new creamery built in 1941.

Elected on the village council in 1937 and 1938, he was elected president in 1937, serving until 1944. He was re-elected in 1947 for one year.

He was a member of Nashville Lodge No. 255, F. & A.M., serving as worshipful master from 1943 to 1945; served as Excellent High Priest of the Mason Chapter No. 171, Royal Arch Masons from 1944 to 1947, had been commander of the Hastings Commandery No. 56, Knights Templar, and was also a member of the Saladin Shrine of Grand Rapids.

For several years before his retirement in 1960 Mr. Olmstead was manager of the Standard Stamping Company.

Born in Assyria township on May 13, 1884, he was a son of Adelbert and Elna (Cargo) Olmstead. He was married to Erma Neal on Feb. 15, 1905, in Kalamo township. He graduated from Argubright's business college in Battle Creek in 1904 and for a short time took a position with the Dental Manufacturing Co. of Cleveland, Ohio.

Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Olmstead moved to a farm in Assyria township where they lived until 1929 when they moved into Nashville.

Besides his wife, Erma, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Otto (Bernice) Dahm and Mrs. Harry (Geraldine) Johnson, both of Nashville; a son, Gerald Olmstead of Grand Rapids; a sister, Mrs. Robert (Hazel) Goitz of Berkeley, and a brother, Clarence, of Detroit; six grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

The body is being returned to Nashville and services will be held Friday at 2 p.m. from the Vogt Funeral home with the Rev. Carter Preston of the Methodist Church officiating. Burial will be made in Lakeview cemetery.
