

Youth, 14, Collapses, Dies in Gym

SUNFIELD—Death of a 14-year-old boy who collapsed Wednesday at the Sunfield School gymnasium, was caused from a fall and "cerebral edema," according to a coroner's report.

Loren Campbell, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Campbell of Sunfield, failed to revive after he collapsed following a three-lap run prior to basketball practice, according to Les Peters, Eaton County coroner.

Coach Robert Peters gave mouth-to-mouth resuscitation pending arrival of a doctor and an inhalator, but revival efforts were futile.

In addition to the parents, three sisters, Jo-Anne, Allene and Patricia, all at home; a grandmother, Mrs. Stella Campbell, and a grandfather, Fred Thrower of North Carolina, survive.

Services will be Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Mapes Funeral Home here, with burial in Meadowbrook Cemetery, Mulliken.
