Krieg served six terms as Eaton sheriff from 1934 to 1946. Later, he joined the State Highway Department, retiring two years ago.

A World War I veteran, he was affiliated with the American Legion, VFW, and Masons.

DeWitt—E. Theodore Marzke, 82, of 307 W. Washington street, DeWitt, died Sunday afternoon, Feb. 24, at Clinton Memorial hospital in St. Johns after a long illness.

Funeral services were held from the Vincent-Rummel Funeral home at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 27. Rev Daniel A. Kelin of the DeWitt Community church officiated and interment was in the DeWitt cemetery.

MR MARZKE was born May 10, 1880 in Erie county, Ohio, the son of Wilhelm and Johnannah Yanz Marzke. He attended school in Riley township, Clinton county.

He was married to Ethel G. Smith at the home of her parents in Riley on March 11, 1908. They lived on a farm in Riley at first, but had been a resident of DeWitt for the past 50 years.

Mr Marzke was a member of the DeWitt Community church, the adult class of the church school; was a member of the DeWitt board of education during 1917-19; a committeeman on the first Boy Scout Troop committee of DeWitt troop No. 77.
