

Services Held Saturday for Loren F. Campbell

Funeral services were held for Loren Fred Campbell, age 14 years, of Logan street, from the Mapes Funeral home Saturday, Feb. 23. Loren collapsed Wednesday afternoon, Feb. 20, at the Sunfield school gym. Death was caused from a fall and "cerebral edema" according to a coroner's report.

Loren, son of Mr and Mrs Harold Campbell, failed to revive after he collapsed following a three-lap run prior to basketball practice, according to Les Peters, Eaton County coroner.

He was born March 21, 1948 in Lansing. Loren was in his freshman year at Sunfield high school and attended the Sunfield Methodist Church. He lived in Sunfield all his life except for one year in Cadillac.

Surviving besides his parents are three sisters, Jo Anne, Alene and Patricia, all at home; a grandmother, Mrs Stella Campbell of rural Sunfield, and a grandfather, Fred Thrower of North Carolina.

The Rev. Eugene Friesen, pastor of the Sunfield Methodist Church, officiated at the two o'clock rites. Interment was made in Meadowbrook cemetery at Mulliken.
