The Hildingers Killed Saturday in BA Minnesota Fire

The tragedy that resulted from the fire early Saturday which des-sa troyed the Breezy Point Lodge at sq Pelican lake 20 miles north of Brainerd, Minn., struck close to home as 11 Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Hildinger, of Cleveland, Ohio, formerly of Lakepi Odessa, lost their lives.

Mr. Hildinger, a native of the Lake Odessa area, was killed when he jumped from the second story bedroom window and struck his head. His wife, who tried to slide down a rope, fell about 20 feet and died in a Brainerd hospital.

Mr. Hildinger, manager of the A. F. Thibodeau company at Cleveland since about 1920, was attending a convention at the lodge. He had been associated in the egg business for 60 years, and was first employed by Byron Archer in the Lake Odessa business. He took over the business after Archer's death until going to Cleveland:

His first wife, Grace Tolles, was a Lake Odessa girl. She died about 17 years ago.
