Earl B. Townsend, 84, Was Barry Official

Nashville—Earl B. Townsend, 84, retired Nashville businessman, died Friday at the home of Floyd Wells near Vermontville.

Mr. Townsend, who was born in Hastings township, operated a grocery here from 1900 to 1906. Then he and his brother, Ray, operated an elevator until 1914, when he sold out to Ray. From 1914-18 Mr. Townsend was Barry county register of deeds. From 1918-23 he was assistant cashier of the former State Savings bank of Nashville. He then moved to Florida, where he stayed until his return here in 1943.

Wife Died in 1947.

In 1895 he married Miss Ada Reynolds in Nashville. She died in 1947.

Surviving are two sons, Ralph of Detroit and Glenn of Clermont, Fla., eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.
