

SERVICES HELD TUESDAY FOR MRS. ALMEDA HOPPER

Funeral services were held Tuesday at 2:00 p. m. from the Otto Funeral home for Mrs. Myra Almeda Hopper. Mrs. Hopper passed away at the residence Sunday evening, January 30. She had been a resident of this community for 76 years.

Mrs. Hopper was born February 15, 1870 at Alidon, Ingham County Michigan, the daughter of Gillespie and Julia Mowrey. On February 7, 1899 she was united in marriage to Fred D. Hooper who preceded her in death.

Surviving is a daughter, Mrs. Seely (Julia) Lozo, two sons, Lyman of Linden, New Jersey and Francis of Louisville, Kentucky, and a sister, Mrs. Harry Hull of Mt. Clair New Jersey and one grandchild.

Mrs. Hopper united with the First Congregational church of Vermontville April 11, 1909 and her entire life time has been spent in active service to her church and community. She was for many years a deaconess of her church and was chairman of that religious board until her failing health caused her to discontinue her office. She was treasurer of the Ladies Christian Association of the church for over 25 years and her devotion to that organization will be a living memorial long after the written records of her service have been forgotten.

Rev. F. Willard Kime officiated and burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.

C. B. Keister, Barry, Dies

Publisher at Middleville Suffers Heart Attack

Middleville—C. B. (Bill) Keister, 51, publisher of the Middleville Sun and Caledonia News, a combined weekly, died Wednesday afternoon of a heart attack in the office of Dr. James Millard here. Mr. Keister had been hospitalized after suffering a heart attack in November. He was born at Pewamo, near Ionia, Sept. 7, 1903. His father, Fred Keister, sr., established the Ionia County News now published by another son, Fred Keister, jr.

A graduate of Ionia High school, Mr. Keister attended Olivet college and Michigan State college. He established the Hazel Park Palladium, a weekly, in 1939, which he operated until he purchased the Middleville paper four years ago.

Mr. Keister was a member of Middleville Rotary and Chamber of Commerce and active in civic affairs.

Surviving besides his wife are a son, David; his brother, Fred Keister, jr., and a sister, Mrs. Dale Cox of Feasterville, Pa.

The body is at Beeler funeral home, Middleville. Funeral services will be held at 2 Saturday at Middleville Methodist church, with burial in Oak Hill cemetery at Ionia.
