

Prominent Mulliken Man Dies

MULLIKEN, Oct. 26—Walter H. Davis, 95, died Tuesday after a long illness in the home of his daughter, Miss Gertrude Davis.

Mr. Davis at various times in his life was postmaster, school teacher, furniture dealer and undertaker in the community. He left the area for a short time in World War I to run a grocery store in Plymouth.

Mr. Davis was a son of pioneer parents in Roxand township and helped to clear the land for first farms. He served as the village postmaster for 18 years and was in the undertaking and furniture business for 20 years.

During his teaching career he served in several of the rural schools and taught for awhile in the Mulliken school.

Besides his daughter, a son, David, of Detroit and one grandchild survive.

Funeral services will be held Friday at 2 p. m. in the Barker funeral home, Rev. G. C. Sanders-field officiating. Burial will be in the Mulliken cemetery.
