

Mr. Lignian was born June 30, 1883, in Kingsley, near Traverse City, the son of Martin and Emma Jane (Frost) Lignian, and was graduated from high school there. His parents moved to Battle Creek at the time John began his newspaper career there. The mother died there Nov. 1, 1921, and the father died at Olivet, March 30, 1928. Both are buried at Olivet.

Mr. Lignian was married July 22, 1925, to Miss Mildred Amy Hicks, who survives. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Manley Hicks and a great-ganddaughter of William Hicks, a pioneer settler in Pennfield township. She is a former business manager of Olivet College and was college bursar for 12 years. She assisted her husband in the publishing of their newspapers.

In August, 1944, Mr. Lignian bought the Bellevue Gazette, but after two years sold it to Walter Cantine of Battle Creek. In September, 1952, Mr. and Mrs. Cantine bought the Grand Ledge Independent and the Bellevue paper has since been owned by Donald Campbell. In 1929, Mr. Lignian bought the Potterville News of Ray S. Willett of Charlotte, and this paper was included in his sale of the Optic to Mr. Tucker last year.

Mr. Lignian was a member of the Michigan Press Assn., the University of Michigan Press Club, the National Editorial Assn., Saladin Temple of the Shrine at Grand Rapids, life member of the Olivet Masonic lodge, the Bellevue Royal Arch Masons, Charlotte Knights Templar and was a charter member of the Olivet Lions Club. He was an active worker in the Olivet Congregational Church, interested in civic enterprises in his home community and served one term on the village council.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sisters, Miss Blanche Lignian, a former Battle Creek newspaper woman, and Miss Mabel Lignian, both of Olivet.

Services were held Monday at 2 p.m. at the Congregational church in Olivet, conducted by Burkhead funeral home, with Rev. Charles B. Hastie, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Hicks cemetery, Calhoun county. Casket bearers were Samuel Robinson, Clyde M. Herrick, Ralph Vahs, Edward A. Goodrich, Burr ridge S. Tucker, Lyle Herbert.
