GLENNA TUBBS

June 26, 1888 - July 9, 1955

Glenna Tubbs was born June 26, 1888 on a farm near Charlotte, Michigan, and passed away at the Clark Memorial Home, Grand Rapids, July 9, 1955.

She was the daughter of Lafayette and Jennie Bishop Tubbs; graduated from the Charlotte High School in 1907, and from Albion College in 1913; later obtaining a Master Degree from Boulder University, Colorado.

Glenna was a teacher in the elementary grades at Parma, Charlotte and Jackson for seventeen and one-half years. She also taught two years at the Wood Junior College, Matteson, Miss., operated by the Board of Home Missions of the Methodist church.

Wherever she made her home she gave unselfish and devoted service to the local Methodist

churches in the Church School and Youth departments. "Aunt Glenna" is a name that will live on and on in the hearts of those who were privileged to come under her teaching and radiant christian living.

Those of the immediate family who cherish her memory are three sisters, Mrs. Melita Halsey of Charlotte, R.F.D., Mrs. Edna Osborne, a twin sister of Comstock, Michigan, and Miss Lulu Tubbs of Mutumbara Mission, S. Rhodesia, S. Africa, and one brother, Mr. Arthur Tubbs, who lives on the old home farm near Charlotte; beside nieces and nephews.

The funeral service was held at Pray's July 11, with burial at the family lot at the Center Eaton cemetery. Rev. Richard W. Wearn, Rev. David Menchhofer, and Rev. George Osborne officiated.
