

Lauren Merrick, Spanish War Veteran, Dies

Lauren E. Merrick, 83, of 237 Lewis Ave., a Spanish-American War veteran who had lived in Billings since 1920, died at a local hospital Monday at 11:25 p.m. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

He was born in Adrian, Mich., on Oct. 26, 1872, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Rufus P. Merrick.

Mr. Merrick entered military service with the 31st regiment, Michigan Volunteer Infantry, as clerk of Company D on May 19, 1898. The company arrived in Cienfuegos, Cuba, aboard the U.S. Transport Chester on Feb. 1, 1899. The company was detailed for provost duty at the City of Sagua la Granda. He was discharged on May 17, 1899.

Mr. Merrick married Miss Maude Lou Pierce in Charlotte, Mich., on June 22, 1902. They came to Joliet in 1915 from Detroit, Mich. His wife died in Billings in 1950.

Survivors include two daughters, Miss Leonie L. Merrick of 237 Lewis Ave., and Miss Nellie L. Merrick of Pleasant Hill, Calif.; two sisters, Mrs. Florence Dean of East Lansing, Mich., and Mrs. Marie Reigler of East Gary, Indiana.

Peary's Widow Succumbs at 92

Portland, Maine — (AP) — Mrs. Josephine Diebitsch Peary, 92, widow of the American naval officer who discovered the North pole in 1909, and an Arctic explorer in her own right, died late Monday.

Mrs. Peary had been confined to her apartment since she suffered a broken hip in January, 1954.

Adm. Robert W. Peary gave her much credit for the success of his Arctic expeditions. She accompanied her husband on several trips, traveling farther north over the ice fields than any other white woman.

Her daughter Marie—called the "Snow Baby"—was born less than 13 degrees from the North pole in 1893, farther north than any other white person.

Burial will be in Arlington National cemetery.
