

Vermontville Pioneer Dies

VERMONTVILLE, April 25—Mrs. Fairy E. Leshar, 94, a member of one of Michigan's pioneer families, died Sunday in the home of her daughter, Mrs. Roy Mathews.

Mrs. Leshar's father, Oscar Williams, was one of the first homesteaders in Oceana county.

She was born in Salem, Ore., in 1861 and migrated to Michigan five years later. The family, because there were no transcontinental railroads traveled by boat to the Isthmus of Panama.

They crossed the Isthmus overland and boarded another boat to New York.

Mrs. Leshar was married to Frank H. Leshar in Potterville in 1879. Mr. Leshar died in 1933. Since then Mrs. Leshar has made her home in Vermontville.

Besides Mrs. Mathews, two other daughters, Mrs. Amos Pitkin of Clio, and Mrs. Frederik Stevens of Flint; a son, Clyde of East Lansing, a brother, Charles Williams, Fowler, Cal., a half-brother, Herbert Williams, Culver City, Cal., 12 grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren, and 14 great-great-grandchildren survive.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 p. m. in the Otto funeral home.

Graveside services will be held at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday in the Fairview cemetery, Mancelona.
