# Coolidge's Widow Dies

## Passes in East After Long Illness

Northampton, Mass. — (AP) — Mrs. Calvin Coolidge, 78, widow of the thirtieth president of the United States, died Monday.

Failing health — a heart condition, more recently complicated by a kidney ailment — had limited her activity in recent years.

In the booming "normalcy" years — 1923 through 1928 — Mrs. Coolidge brought to the White

House just the qualities of warm-hearted graciousness needed to complement her husband's austerity.

While subtly avoiding all but the edges of the limelight that beats upon the presidency, she succeeded in adding to the popularity of her husband.

Had Good Education.

In an era in which frugality was becoming increasingly unfashionable she accommodated herself to Calvin Coolidge's thrift with out, herself, acquiring a reputation for being penurious.

She brought to her marriage a good background of intelligence and education, but always deferred to her husband's political sagacity. Disclaiming any knowledge of how a government should
