

Local Auto Dealer Suffers Fatal Heart Attack Monday Night

Charles H. VanSickle, 62, died of a heart attack Monday night, at his residence on Clinton Trail in Eaton Township. The Automobile dealer, a partner in the VanSickle-Rowland Ford Agency in Charlotte, has been suffering from a heart condition for the past 4 years.

Mr. VanSickle was born on May 24, 1895, in Salem, Michigan, the son of John and Dora (Andrews) VanSickle and moved with his parents to Ionia.

He was a veteran of World War I and upon his discharge from service married Lela McCauley on September 17, 1919, in Detroit where he was active in real estate and worked for Universal Credit Corp.

On November 23, 1943, he moved to Charlotte with his family when he took over the Ford agency here. He was a member of Charlotte Lodge No. 120, & A. M. and the American Legion.

He is survived by his wife. Funeral services will be held at the Burkhead Chapel with Rev. H. B. Loomis officiating. The body will be moved to Wayne County for burial in Thayer Cemetery at Salem.
