FORMER VERMONTVILLE MAN DIES AT PETOSKEY

Was Member of First Graduating Class

Dr. George A. Parmenter, 86, Petoskey resident and practicing dentist for 54 years prior to his retirement in the fall of 1954, died Sunday night at his home following an illness of several months.

Dr. Parmenter was born in Vermontville, the son of Dr. William Parmenter, a physician, and Harriet Hamilton Parmenter. He was a member of the first graduating class of Vermontville and graduated from the University of Michigan School of Dentistry in the class of 1895.
