**Dr. Stanhope P. Huyck
 Taken by Death**

Funeral services were held Saturday morning for Doctor Stanhope P. Huyck, a retired Sunfield physician, from the Mapes Funeral home in Sunfield. The Rev. Fr. Louis Flohe of St. Patrick's church, Portland, officiated at the nine o'clock rites.

Dr. Huyck passed away unexpectedly in a Detroit hotel, May 14, while visiting friends there. He was 54 years of age.

The deceased practiced medicine in Sunfield from 1931 until his retirement in 1952.

He was born June 25, 1903 at Clio, the son of Ellsworth and Harriet Huyck. He was a graduate of Flint high school. In 1927 he graduated from University of Michigan medical school and practiced two years in Flint before coming to Sunfield. He had served his internship at Harper hospital in Detroit.

Dr. Huyck was a member of St. Patrick's church in Portland.

He served 38 months as a captain in the medical corps in World War II and was overseas in the European theater of operations for 26 months.

Surviving are a son, Hans, and a daughter, Katherine Grommans, of Sunfield; and three grandchildren.

Interment was made in Wacousta cemetery, Wacousta.
