War" and "The Centennial History of Michigan and Its People" in 1939, in addition to "Historic Michigan" in 1924.

His goal always was the wider recognition of the richness of Michigan's historical heritage.

Dr. Fuller, an avid reader of history, adopted the habit when he was a freshman in college of keeping notes as he read. He had boxes full of notes on every book he had read in the past 50 years, and often was able to refer to them when corresponding with friends and historians all over the United States.

He was 73 when he retired, but that didn't stop him from learning. He learned to read and speak Spanish with his daughter, Florence in recent years. He previously had mastered Greek, Latin, French and German.

He was married to Belle Vandervere in 1897. She died in 1920. In 1927, he married Helen L. Gustine, who died in 1949.

Mr. Gray died Saturday morning in the home of a nephew, Cecil Gray, on the homestead where he was born. He had suffered a stroke in the fall.

Mr. Gray was the son of Mark and Sabrina Gray who came over the Clinton trail to settle in Michigan close to a century ago. He was an inveterate hunter and fisherman and an apiarian as well as a farmer.

His wife, Rilla, to whom he had been married 72 years, died in March of 1956.

Surviving are three sisters, Mrs. Ida Leak, Woodbury; Mrs. Minnie Trowbridge, Vermontville and Mrs. George H. (Maude) Post, Hastings, and many nieces and nephews.
