

# Lawyer Dies In Charlotte

## Heart Attack Fatal to B. G. Cameron

Charlotte—Berton G. Cameron, 62, died unexpectedly of a heart attack about 6 p. m. Friday in his law office here.

Mr. Cameron was Eaton county prosecutor in 1942-46 and state representative in 1927-28. He was president of the Eaton County Bar association.

He was a second lieutenant in the field artillery in World war I and later a major in the Michigan National Guard. He was a member of the American Legion and Charlotte lodge No. 120, F&AM.

Surviving are his wife, Helen; two sons, Douglas of Hawthorne, Calif., Gordon of San Jose, Calif., and a brother, John of Tampa, Fla.

Funeral services will be held at 2 Tuesday at the Burkhead chapel. Burial in Maple Hill cemetery. The body is at the Burkhead funeral home.

## Arthur M. Demaray, Retired Postman, Dies During Apartment House Visit

Arthur M. Demaray, 64, of 128 S. Woodrow ave., parcel post carrier in Battle Creek from the time the service started until his retirement in February, 1953, was fatally stricken by 9:30 a.m. this morning while at his apartment house at 22 W. Fountain street.

Coroner Ralph Callahan said death was due to a coronary attack.

Upon coming here from Vermontville, Mr. Demaray joined the parcel post service on Feb. 28, 1913, and became a well known personage in the community.

Native of Barry County He was born in Maple Grove Township on Nov. 21, 1892, the son of Charles H. and Harriet (Bassett) Demaray. The mother died when Arthur was 12 and he went to live with Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Hawkins in Vermontville.

Mr. Demaray was first married to Ina Canfield, by whom he had one daughter, Mrs. H. R. (Aletha) Kendall of 14 Greenwood ave. In 1934 he was married to Vida Hammond, who survives. They also had one daughter, Mrs. Max (Vianna) Crandall of Florida City, Fla. Mr. Demaray also of
